#### Chairperson's Report

South West Community Transport continues to go from strength to strength.

Our volunteers are at the heart of our success and allow us to continue to provide affordable transport to those who need it most.

Our volunteer Car Scheme has had another successful year operating in the North West and South West of Glasgow. Volunteer drivers provided door to door transport for our clients allowing them to attend 383 hospital or healthcare appointments. Our car scheme service is for people who are isolated, disabled, elderly, who do not have access to a car and are unable to use public transport. Without our service, attendance at these vital healthcare appointments would be missed.

Maureen McBrayne, one of our Hoppa Shoppa members who sadly passed away, bequeathed a sum of money to us. With that donation we purchased an accessible mobility



car to allow wheelchair users to access our Volunteer Car Scheme.

Our weekly Hoppa Shoppa service has operated continuously over the year, taking our members to a variety of shopping centres and day trips. Some of these members struggle to use public transport and some require to use wheelchairs or mobility aids. The Hoppa Shoppa service allows its users to meet socially and feel part of a community, reducing social isolation, exclusion and loneliness.

One of the highlights of our year was being able to add a further two accessible minibuses to our fleet, allowing us to increase our provision to organisations, most of which are for the elderly, people with disabilities, youths, people with additional support needs, toddler groups, schools, nurseries etc.



Another highlight of our year was becoming a Glasgow Living Wage Employer, which shows we are a responsible employer committed to providing our employees with what is needed to cover the basic cost of living.


I am delighted that South West Community Transport has had another successful year, and hope that it continues to grow and develop.


As always, I would like to thank all the staff and volunteers who make South West Community Transport such a fantastic organisation.



#### **Minibus Hires**




#### **Hoppa Shoppa Destinations**
